



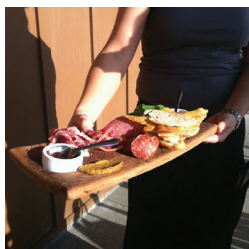

Cafe Sevilla, San Diego Gaslamp Joe Santos, Manager

When Manager Joe Santos wanted a unique serving tray for the new Cafe Sevilla's bread and tapenade tray, BottleHood delivers serving boards with an inset for a 4 oz. tapenade serving container made from wine bottle bottoms. To add to the ambience of the new tapas bar and restaurant, the bar uses short Mediterranean 8 oz. style wine glasses made from the bottoms of clear wine bottles.



Solace and the Moonlight Lounge, Encinitas Matt and Young-Mi Gordon, Owners

Longtime friends and supporters of BottleHood, Matt and Young-Mi worked with BottleHood from the design phase of their new restaurant location in Encinitas. The restaurant has a two-story entrance with a staircase to the second floor. BottleHood designed and built a chandelier made of 24 1.5 liter wine bottles and barrel tops from three American Oak wine barrels, trimmed in the steel bands from the barrels. We also provided a set of three fixtures with two lights on each for the communal dining table and pendant drops for over the bar area.



In addition, Matt wanted a unique serving platter for his artisan cheese and charcuterie platter and asked us to design serving trays with two insets for 2 oz. condiment containers to go with the dishes. The solution has turned out to be quite popular in several locations and is now produced in several configurations.



Sea Rocket Bistro, South Park Chad White and Elena Rivellino, Owners

When new executive chef and co-owner, Chad White joined Elena Rivellino in South Park, they kicked up their serving trays with the additions of BottleHood's new serving trays made from 750 ml wine bottles. Chad uses them for serving organic garlic roasted almonds and shiso peppers! The Hood also delivered charcuterie trays made from wine barrel staves.



Local Habit, Hillcrest Barry Braden and Adam Hiner, Owners

When the crew over at the newly established Local Habit wanted a unique lighting solution they came to BottleHood. The team at the Hood took 3 liter Stone bottles and made huge, high power LED pendant lights to drop from the Habit's 30' ceilings. To add a bit more "brand" we sandblasted their logo on some double weight German ale bottles to drop as pendant lights over the bar!
